In the Picture above, you see the headmaster Mr.Xavier stand with the two children who have won a shield for the school. Teacher Mary also stands along. The school was started in the 80s for the benefit of the children living on the hills most of whom were Muslim. There have been more than 3000 children who have been benefitted by the school. The school once boasted of strength of around 800 children for many years. But there has been some problems with the approval of the land with the government. But it is in the verge of coming to a conclusion where the school can begin to function again as before.

## The Alumini..

It was a joy to see about 30 alumini (picture on the right) come together and recollect all the good things the school has done in their lives. Most of them shared, how the school was a blessing to them and how they are placed in different jobs today because of the school. Some of them earn about Rs.12000 to Rs.17000 as monthly income. Some of the women are housewives, some still pursue their higher education. Their one cry was for the school to be revived to its highest glory and they would co-operate and associate in every possible way! One girl shared that even before the school was started Pastor Job used to distribute buns. She came to the school just to get food in the afternoon because if they stayed at home they would have no food to eat.





## Future Vision..

We are dealing with the land issue right now, but we are hoping that it will soon be solved, before we start the next academic year. IPA has a vision to start an English school in that area for the children. With the support and co-operation of all those living there, we can continue to do a lot more for the people and children of Mielkal.
