This used to be a fully functional Children home for the tribal girls started by Mother Ruth.

It was started in the year 2003. 50 girls have benefitted from the love and care shown in the home.

But now, it is a center for the tribal people of the karamadai area. The children come and receive the benefits of food and other necessities every month. A full-fledged Church with 80 people is functioning here.

It was very difficult to run it as a Children Home because of the government formalities and the big expenses that the home incurred in the maintenance of the centre as a Children Home.

Devi is a beautiful young girl, who studied in the Karamadai Home for many years. Today she misses the love, care and the food given in the home. But she is grateful for the time she spent here. “I miss brother and sister”, sobbed Devi, referring to the home parents – Pastor Babu and his wife Mitchi. The affection with which they brought the children up, has had a great impact on them.

Even now 8 children receive help every month from the Karamadai center. They come on a Saturday from far off tribal places and stay at the center and receive financial help, with which they can buy food and other necessities for the month. They get prayed over and have a time of fellowship and pray for the sponsors during the time.

Pastor Babu himself is a tribal boy, who studied in the Jambugandy Tribal home. Mother Ruth took a lot of care and educated him. Today he is a pastor for the tribal center church there with about 80 people. He and his wife Mirchi have 2 children named Trishal and Trishanth. They minister for the glory of God.
